The House voted on Wednesday to give Republicans full control over the House Rules Committee, the first rule change following the midterm election. House Democratic Caucus Chairman Joe Crowley defeated Rep. Cedric Richmond, D-La., who was backed by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, in an internal party vote. Richmond was an outspoken advocate for Pelosi and close ally to House Majority Leader Steny Hoyer, a Democrat from Maryland who's also in line to become House Minority Leader. The Rules Committee, which controls the rules for the House, was originally controlled by Republicans during the last session of Congress. Republicans have talked for months about how to change the rules of the House to make it harder for Democrats to push legislation. While the rule change has to go through the House Rules Committee, it also has to be approved by the Senate in order to make it to the president's desk. It's not immediately clear if that will happen before Trump leaves office. The vote Wednesday was 186-187. Two Democrats voted against the measure and three Republicans voted for it. The Rules Committee is also responsible for nominating candidates for two important positions: the next speaker of the House, as well as the next majority leader. Pelosi and Hoyer are currently the top two leaders of the Democratic caucus, and have been for several years. Democrats have been trying to replace Pelosi as House speaker, while Republicans are trying to replace Hoyer as House minority leader. Two Democrats, Rep. Tim Ryan, D-Ohio, and Rep. Jared Huffman, D-Calif., have already said they would run against Pelosi, while House GOP Caucus Chairman Liz Cheney of Wyoming and Rep. Jim Renacci of Ohio have already announced they will run against Hoyer. Q: Suppress ReSharper errors for an entire project I'm working on a VSTO project with .NET 3.5.
